The Kearney Area Community Foundation Takes a Big Step Toward the Future!

It may be hard to believe, but 2025 will mark 30 years since the Kearney Area Community Foundation (KACF) was founded! The Foundation has been very fortunate to experience the support of Kearney and the surrounding area. That support has helped us grow in our mission to connect people who care with causes that matter.

Our growth has been so great, that we are able to take advantage of an amazing opportunity. This fall, KACF will be moving into a new building. The building, located at **2908 W 39th Street**, will provide us with more space to attain our goals and implement our strategic plan.



The biggest benefit of the new location will be the ability to host meetings, seminars and celebrations in The Community Collaboration Space. This will be located in the center of the building and will be equipped with technology that will make it a prime area for people to meet. In addition to being an option for KACF to hold events and meetings, it will be used to support local nonprofit organizations.

KACF staff will be able to utilize the space to hold trainings and seminars for area nonprofits and also advise those interested in furthering their charitable impact. The trainings will range in topics from ways to boost fundraising, attracting donors and having a successful campaign during Give Where You Live, our 24-hour giving day. The Community Collaboration Space will be a great resource for those looking to make a difference in our area.

The new building will also have room for KACF to grow in the future. At **4,581 square feet**, the building gives current staff room to do more hands-on projects and provides the option to add more offices if KACF decides to expand its services.

Local Students Get a Boost Toward Higher Education

Their Pursuit of Higher Education

Scholarships are the building blocks for future generations, providing the financial assistance for local students to fulfill their dreams of higher education.

Omar Corona received the Arthur E. Klinkacek Promise Scholarship after hearing about the scholarship from his school counselor. He will be attending Central Community College-Hastings and plans to get an associate's degree in Diesel Technology and then a master's degree in Diesel Power Generation. He's worked with Nebraska Generation Service throughout high school and plans to continue to work with them after finishing college. He would like to eventually own his own mechanic shop. "I believe it takes only one person to change your whole family's future," Corona says. "With the help of the Arthur E. Klinkacek Promise Scholarship it motivates me to keep working harder knowing that I have their support and show that everything is possible in life with hard work."

Erica Lockhorn received the Asher Family Scholarship. She says she decided to apply after a change in income with her family. She plans to attend the University of Nebraska-Kearney and major in Business Administration with an emphasis in Finance. After getting her degree, she plans to have a sustainable job that she enjoys or possibly start her own business. "The Asher Family Scholarship was a blessing that helped me reduce the stress of the financial aspect of attending college," says Lockhorn. "I am extremely thankful there are families and organizations like this that help high school students like me to be able to pursue higher education with a much smaller financial burden."

Claire Rogers received the Youth Leadership Kearney Scholarship. She applied for the scholarship after being involved in Youth Leadership while in high school. She will be attending the University of Nebraska-Lincoln and will be studying Pre-Pharmacy. After finishing college, she hopes to move back to Kearney to be able to give back to the community that helped shape her to be the person she is today. "The Youth Leadership Kearney Scholarship is a huge blessing to me and my family," Rogers says. "I am so thankful to be able to put this scholarship money towards my college education. It is truly a life changing opportunity to have received this, and it goes to show how Kearney always pushes their young leaders to be the best they can be by supporting them in any way possible."

Asher Saulsbury received the Kearney Area Chamber of Commerce Ag
Committee Scholarship. He plans to attend the University of Nebraska-Lincoln and

Arthur E. Klinkacek left a large impact on the community in the form of a \$2 million gift to the Kearney Area Community Foundation from his estate. In honor of his wishes to help the community, the Foundation created the Arthur Klinkacek Community Enrichment Fund, for community preservation and enrichment purposes. Since its inception, more than \$600,000 has been granted to local causes.





This spring, six nonprofit organizations were awarded a total of \$46,500 in grants.

- Choice Family Healthcare received \$4,000 for their You Matter Project, which will focus on updating the floors and painting the walls in their clinic to make it more welcoming.
- Forward Kearney Building Fund was awarded \$12,000 to help with various needs in their Welcome Center.
- Kearney Area Arts Council received \$7,500 for the Kearney
 Jazz Education Project, which supports Jazz at the World, to
 establish the Central Nebraska Youth Jazz Ensemble (CNYJE)
 and bring in a guest artist to play a concert with the CNYJE for
 the community.
- Kearney Catholic High School Foundation was awarded \$10,000 to support their new public outdoor activities facility.
- **Kearney Family YMCA** received \$8,000 to help expand and make improvements to their Family Fun Center.
- Little Eagles Learning Center in Overton was awarded \$5,000 to help build a facility to expand their childcare services.

In my time at Central Community College, I have met with many students and their support people as they make the decision to better their lives through education. Whether it is pursuing a certificate in commercial wiring or entrepreneurship, getting a

full degree in criminal justice, or taking general education classes that they will transfer to a four-year college, there is one thing that's constant: How will I pay for this?

Community colleges nationwide are seeing continued enrollment increases post-pandemic. More and more students are choosing a two-year college path and finding career success, as those colleges with a high vocational program focus are seeing the largest increase. Central

Community College has seen this growth as well, and the Kearney Area Community Foundation has seen several of our scholarship recipients taking those generous donations to a community college. While our cost is much lower than a public or private 4-year college, there is still a cost to attend for our students and they rely on scholarship opportunities. In addition, according to the Community College Research Center, 65% of all students at two-year colleges have an income level below \$50,000 per year. So, the need is great.



All college students across the board face financial burdens, so the support of scholarships is always welcome. Scholarships are an investment in that specific student's future – giving them greater access to options in higher education. It is our job once the students are here to ensure they are given the best education and opportunities to be employed and successful. If a scholarship recipient chooses to use that gift at Central Community College, know that 90% of our graduates employed full-time stay within our 25-county service area. They are our neighbors and future community leaders, and an investment in that is always worthwhile.
