## "Building for Tomorrow" Applications Now Online

The Kearney Area Community Foundation (KACF) "Building for Tomorrow" (BFT) fund is transitioning from paper grant applications to an online system called Kaleidoscope. This new software was purchased thanks to donations made through the Foundation's Edison Society.

Before Kaleidoscope, hardcopy grant applications were dropped off at the Foundation office. Now, the Foundation can go even greener and continue to social distance, while also making it easier for nonprofit organizations in our community to apply for grants.

"Since Kaleidoscope worked so smoothly for our 2019 scholarships, we wanted to see if it could do the same thing with our BFT grant applications," said Laurel McKellips, Program Manager at KACF. "Not only does Kaleidoscope simplify the process, it also allows applicants to save and continue their grant application whenever and where ever."



The BFT grant typically funds projects or programs in the Kearney area and surrounding communities. Grants are made to nonprofit, federally tax-exempt 501(c)(3) qualified organizations, or organizations delivering a project or program which have a fiscal relationship with a qualified charity.

Applications are accepted on a biannual basis with the approaching deadline of **August 1**. Organizations are encouraged to read the grants guidelines by visiting <a href="www.kearneyfoundation.org/building-for-tomorrow">www.kearneyfoundation.org/building-for-tomorrow</a> to determine if their organization qualifies. The next BFT grant cycle is **February 1, 2021**.

# Give Kearney Now

Grassroots Effort to Support Local Nonprofits Affected by COVID-19

Powered by the Kearney Area Community Foundation (KACF), Give Kearney Now is an online donation platform to help raise funds for local nonprofits who are working on the front lines during the COVID-19 pandemic, as well as those affected due to loss of revenue or an increase in expenses.

As of June 1, donors can support local nonprofits by visiting <a href="www.givekearneynow.org">www.givekearneynow.org</a> and donating directly to their favorite charities online. There, donors can view the 44 local nonprofits participating in Give Kearney Now. Each participating nonprofit is listed with a link to their organization's website and donation page.

These local nonprofits are providing food, rent assistance, utility assistance, medicine, mental health, childcare (and so much more) for people living and/or working in the Kearney area suffering financial hardship due to the COVID-19 outbreak. Our local nonprofits are assisting those most vulnerable during these unprecedented times.

For instance, the Kearney area's local Salvation Army has been working on the front lines during COVID-19, providing for those affected in our community.

"We have long helped people in need with rental and utility assistance, as well as providing staples through our food pantry. But with the COVID-19 crisis, those needs have and are increasing. We have eliminated all pantry restrictions, currently allowing unlimited access and have also increased the number of households that we are able to help with rental and utility assistance," said Lisa Lieth, Case Manager at the Salvation Army.

The Salvation Army anticipates an even greater need ahead as freezes on evictions and shut-off notices expire and unemployment benefits begin to be exhausted.

"We feel blessed to be able to funnel the generosity of many to those who most desperately need it in our community," said Leith.

But, the Salvation Army is not alone in its efforts to support others in the Kearney area during COVID-19. BraveHearts Equine Assisted Psychotherapy & Learning is focused on our youth during these trying times.

"With all that 2020 has brought to us, or perhaps taken away from us, our children and youth have taken a direct hit," said Nancy Lyon, co-founder of BraveHearts.

Loss of school, loss of social interactions and feeling lost in uncertainly are what youth are experiencing. Many parents have told Lyon that they have seen a regression in their child's behavior and academic skills throughout this pandemic.

"But help is just a corral away!" said Lyon. "Horses have a unique way of building those confidence skills, developing healthy coping skills and most of all, just letting them be kids. Your donation will provide scholarships for our summer and fall programs and your future caretakers will thank you."

## A Look at the Foundation's Impact

THRU PAST BOARD CHAIR EYES

In our 25 years, the Kearney Area Community Foundation (KACF) has continued to grow and work for the Kearney and surrounding communities. In 1995 when KACF began, few community members knew what a community foundation was or could even imagine the impact it would have on our area.

"Since then, KACF has communicated to the public the value of the Foundation and why community leaders should be engaged and support it," said Marilyn Hadley KACF board chair in 2004-2006.

For instance, what started out as a corn field grew into an active, full-feature public park. The Yanney Heritage Park Foundation (YHPF) was originally created under KACF to develop and sustain the park.

"Still standing strong in 2020, there are no other parks from Omaha to Denver that have the wide array of facilities that Yanney Heritage Park does," said Tom Tye, founding board member and past chair of the Yanney Heritage Park Foundation. "Our partnership with the Foundation was instrumental in making this happen."

YHPF is only one of the many nonprofit organizations the Foundation had a part in helping grow into what we know it to be today.

"It's not a secret anymore," said Dave Chally, KACF board chair in 2008–2010. "The community has become familiar with the Foundation and its mission to enhance the quality of life in the Kearney area by effectively implementing crucial funds needed during times of uncertainty."

"You can see that right now with the funds and campaign that have come up as part of the COVID-19 pandemic." said Mike Tve. KACF board chair in 2014-2016. "Basically, the Foundation is always there as a partner and resource to whatever those community efforts are."

With more than \$57 million distributed back to the community since 1995 in grants, scholarships and program support, the evidence of the Foundation's community impact has become known throughout its 25 years.

"Community foundations are built to work for the community," said Ignice Wiebusch, a founding board member and KACF board chair in 1998-2000.

"And that's what the Foundation has been doing for the past 25 years. It has truly been a gift to the Kearney area."

Another program in the community, which would not have become

a reality without the help of the Foundation, is the humane society. Two local ladies, who were passionate about not euthanizing lost and homeless animals in the community, came together and worked with KACF to establish a fund.

In 2002, the Kearney Area Humane Society Fund was created under KACF to educate the public about the humane care and treatment of all animals and actively encourage pet population reduction. This would later be known as the Kearney Area Animal Shelter as they branched out on their own to build a shelter, hire staff and attain their 501(c)(3) status.

"The Foundation has been building a portfolio of people, places and organizations within these past 25 years and you can see their finger prints on those projects within our community," said Chally.

"The community may not have been aware of the Foundation's mark on so many large community projects, but now that message is becoming more clear," said Mike Tve.

The growth, strength and integrity of the Foundation over the years has given the organization visibility and credibility, which grew KACF's audience and donor base year after year, allowing the Foundation to acquire more than \$24 million in total assets.

In its infancy, 18 years ago to be precise, the Foundation awarded just over \$10,000 in scholarships to local youth. In 2020, the Foundation awarded over \$143.000 in scholarships in Kearney and the surrounding areas.

The Kearney Area Community Foundation was created to be here in perpetuity. What kind of impact will KACF have on the community over the next 25 years? One can only imagine.

## **Baldwins Move Charitable Giving Legacy**

Last year, a local family decided to dissolve their family's private foundation, the Theodore G. Baldwin Foundation, and chose the Kearney Area Community Foundation (KACF) to manage its assets. With that, the Ted Baldwin Donor Advised Fund was established. By creating a donor advised fund, the Baldwins will

shift the management, reporting and oversight to KACF as they begin their retirement later this year.

"Through the years, we had seen the Community Foundation develop many of the same goals and ideals that the Theodore G. Baldwin Foundation had, and we wanted to continue to provide a charitable outlet by streamlining the Theodore G. Baldwin Foundation to that of KACF," said Mike Baldwin, a local attorney.

In 1983, 11 years after the passing of his father, Mike established the foundation with money left by his mother, Ellen, when she sold her shares of the J.A. Baldwin Mfg. Company. Later changed to Baldwin Filters, the company was started in 1936 by Mike's grandfather J.A. Baldwin and was later led by his father Theodore (Ted) Baldwin.

Since its inception, the Theodore G. Baldwin Foundation has awarded more than \$5 million in grants to local nonprofits. "It wasn't our money to begin with, so it is easier to give away something that never belonged to you," said Mike. "We just want to help."

Mike and his wife, Jo, are happy to continue the tradition of granting money to nonprofits, schools and government entities. "The transition in grant making is easy and KACF helps us accomplish our charitable giving goals," said Jo.

Grants are made to nonprofit, federally tax-exempt 501(c)(3) qualified organizations, or organizations delivering a project or program which have a fiscal relationship with a qualified charity in the Kearney area.

The Baldwin's three children will be their successor advisors, providing opportunity for their family to continue to give to the community for years to come.

"We continue to encourage others to set up funds through the Foundation, which allow them to see the benefits of KACF. We promote the Foundation because it's an easy thing to do," said Mike.



## **New Grant Opportunity Through** Klinkacek Community Enrichment Fund

Arthur E. Klinkacek wanted to give back to his community and he did just that with a gift of more than \$2 million to the Kearney Area Community Foundation (KACF) from his estate.



In 2019, the Arthur E. Klinkacek Promise Scholarship Fund was launched and has awarded \$80,000 in scholarships in two short years.

Beginning in 2020, the Arthur Klinkacek Community Enrichment Fund will award grants to local organizations for programs and projects that will enrich the lives and communities for those in Buffalo County.

"The Klinkacek Community Enrichment Fund is endowed so it will give back to our community for years to come," said Judi Sickler, President/CEO of KACF. "What an amazing and generous way for someone to leave a legacy that will continually make an impact on local lives."

Since these grants may be larger and more competitive, there will be a pre-application form and review process.

Once the pre-application is approved, nonprofits will be given access to an online grant application, unique to the Arthur Klinkacek Community Enrichment Fund.

This online portal will allow committee members to score each application in a safe and secure way, helping us do our part in social distancing while still providing for those local nonprofits working hard in our community.

- Community impact
- Feasibility
- Collaboration
- Financial plan
- Leadership • Overall impression
- Alignment with Kearney Area Community Foundation priorities
