

# Turning Homes into Funds to Help Others

When Al and Kathy Emken invested in property several years ago, they had no idea their investment would turn out to be a gift to their community!

In 1990, the Emkens decided they wanted to get out of the "landlord business". They owned a couple of homes in Grand Island, one being their first home as newlyweds, that they used as rentals to provide income for their active family. Now that Kearney was their home, owning rental properties 45 miles down the road was beginning to be a nuisance.



Al approached the Kearney Area Community Foundation to see if there were any tax advantages in donating the houses to the Foundation. The houses passed inspection and were approved by the KACF board, following the Foundation's "gift acceptance policy".

"This was a brilliant tax planning strategy. The Emkens were able to avoid capital gains taxes and were able to write off the value of the rental houses, thus they reduced their taxes," stated Tom McCarty, Associate Broker and Realtor at Coldwell Banker, and KACF Board Member. The Foundation sold the homes and the net proceeds were placed in a Donor Advised Fund the Emkens use to make grants back to their favorite charities.

"Our first priority was the tax advantage, but equally important to us was putting the proceeds in a donor advised fund so that we could make grants when we wanted. We didn't have to do anything with it right away, and this allowed us to take our time deciding how we wanted to give back," Al noted. "This gave us flexibility to make decisions when and how we wanted. Here we are 15 years later and we still have monies in our donor advised fund to make future grants. We are also able to add to our fund when the opportunity arises. We enjoy having options."


# ENTERTAINMENT HEADLINERS

#### Seven Grants to Local Non-Profits to Build for Tomorrow

The Building for Tomorrow Grants Program awarded seven grants to charitable organizations for programs and/or projects that will enhance the quality of life for residents of Kearney and the surrounding communities. Applications will be accepted on a bi-annual basis with deadlines of August 1 and February 1.

During the February 2016 grant cycle, seven organizations were awarded mini-grants totaling \$8,000.

#### BraveHearts Equine Assisted Psychotherapy & Learning (\$500):

Helping children in Buffalo County to attend a four-week "HorsePowered" Math summer program.

#### Central Mediation Center (\$1,000):

Aid the Small Claims Mediation Program in Buffalo County.

#### Compass (\$1,000):

Provide family celebration baskets with family fun activities to support parents hard work to reunite with their children.

#### Crane River Theatre (\$1,500):

Assisting with housing costs to bring in professional artists to the community during the summer.

#### Girl Scouts Spirit of Nebraska (\$500):

Offer a summer program in Kearney to give girls the chance to experience the Olympic Games in their own state.

#### Kearney Jubilee Center (\$2,500):

Assist with the construction and remodeling of the Center to keep it safe and open for customers and staff.

#### UNK Frank House (\$1,000):

Provide proper archival storage materials to ensure collected artifacts are preserved.
