### **UNIVERSAL SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION OPENS FEBRUARY 1**

The Kearney Area Community Foundation manages 55 scholarship funds. ### KLINKACEK COMMUNITY ENRICHMENT GRANTS DUE APRIL 15

The Arthur Klinkacek Community Enrichment Fund's grant cycle is biannual with deadlines of **April 15 and October 15**. To view guidelines, fill out a Letter of Intent (LOI), or find more information, please visit www. kearneyfoundation.org/klinkacek. (Don't forget to allow time for your LOI submittal and approval, which are required before the link to the application is given. The deadline for the LOI is 15 days before the due date of the application.)

#### **BUILDING FOR TOMORROW (BFT) GRANTS DUE AUGUST 1**

The BFT grant typically funds projects or programs in the Kearney area and surrounding communities. Grants are made to nonprofit, federally tax-exempt 501(c)(3) qualified organizations, or organizations delivering a project or program which have a fiscal relationship with a qualified charity.

Applications are accepted on a biannual basis with the deadlines of **February 1 and August 1**. Organizations are encouraged to read the grants guidelines by visiting www.kearneyfoundation.org/building-fortomorrow to determine if their organization qualifies.

Thank you, Kearney area donors, for "giving where you live"this community is amazing! On behalf of the participating local nonprofits, we thank you for your generosity.



Now that we've begun a new year, many people make New Year's resolutions. While many resolutions focus on improving oneself, have you considered making a resolution that improves your community? There are a lot of different opportunities for you to make a difference and the Kearney Area Community Foundation (KACF) can help you every step of the way. Here are some ways you can make an impact.

**Donate:** Whether you make a donation once a month or once a year, any donation-no matter how much-can make a difference for a cause you're passionate about.

Donor Advised Fund: A Donor Advised Fund (DAF) is a great way to make an impact on multiple charities. KACF holds your money in the fund; you decide when and how you'd like the money to be distributed. By opening a DAF with KACF, you remain involved and active in charitable giving by retaining "advising privileges" to recommend how KACF should make grants from the fund. We can also help connect you with local causes that matter to you.



Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD): This is a term you're probably very familiar with if you do a lot of work with your Individual Retirement Account (IRA). QCDs are donations made from your IRA that go directly to a charity. QCDs are a great option because they count toward your required minimum distribution and since the money is going directly to charity, the distribution is not considered taxable income.

Charitable Trust: A charitable trust is a great way to ensure you make an impact on your community that lasts beyond your lifetime. With a charitable trust, you can set money aside during your life and then that money will be distributed to one or more charities as a part of your legacy once you pass.

Volunteer: Money isn't the only thing you can donate to make a difference in your community. Consider donating your time by volunteering with a nonprofit that supports a cause you're passionate about. KACF can help you determine what local nonprofits would be a great fit for you and your interests.
